## How to get your Municipal Historic Resources listed on the Alberta Register








### Alberta Register of Historic Places... Canadian Register of Historic Places...

- ✓ Municipal Historic Resources may be eligible for listing on the Alberta Register of Historic Places and the Canadian Register of Historic Places.
- ✓ Listing on the Alberta Register will make sites eligible for funding through the Alberta Historical Resources Foundation.



## 1.Be eligible!







#### The Evaluation Process...

#### 1. Assess eligibility

- Is the resource an excluded type?

#### 2. Assess significance

- What are the heritage values?
- Which significance criteria apply?

#### 3. Assess integrity

- Does the site still communicate its significance?









#### 1. Assess Eligibility... (Is the resource an excluded type?)

#### **Type 1 Exclusions**

(no exceptions)

- Places outside municipal jurisdiction
- Places situated in an historical park or village
- Small movable objects
- Reconstructions
- Human remains

#### **Type 2 Exclusions**

(special exceptions)

- Cemeteries
- Birthplaces or graves
- Places commemorative in nature
- Resources that have been moved
- Resources that achieved significance in the last 50 years





# Designation

Designation is a tool municipalities use to conserve significant places. A Municipal Historic Resource cannot be altered without the municipality's permission. The law requires that the owner (or lessee) of a Municipal Historic Resource obtain written permission from the municipality before altering the site in any way.



## Before Designation

Preserving a historic place through designation requires a long-term partnership between the property's owner and the municipality; a partnership based upon understanding the heritage value of the place.




# The Designation Process

Step 3: After the Bylaw is Passed

Step 4: Listing on the Alberta Register of Historic Places




