


Alberta's Engineering Marvel **BROOKS AQUEDUCT NATIONAL AND PROVINCIAL HISTORIC SITE**

Canada's Deadliest Rockslide FRANK SLIDE INTERPRETIVE CENTRE

Open Daily Year Round

Summer hours: July and August, 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. September through June, 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

On the fateful day of April 29, 1903, 90 million tons of limestone came crashing down Turtle Mountain, burying part of the town of Frank and killing at least 90 people. Visit Frank Slide Interpretive Centre and explore the geology of Canada's deadliest rockslide. Discover the people who depended on the coal mines of the Crowsnest Pass and see how they dealt with this and other disasters.

LOUGHEED HOUSE NATIONAL AND PROVINCIAL HISTORIC SITE

From 1891 to 1936, Lougheed House, then called Beaulieu, was a political and social hub in downtown Calgary. This stunning 2.8 acre property, now a National Historic site, was also home to Sir James and Lady Lougheed and their six children.
