Keynote Speaker:

Bernard Flaman

We are pleased to announce that the Keynote Speaker for Thursday of our 2013 Municipal Heritage Forum is Bernard Flaman.

Bernard Flaman is a registered architect working in the field of Heritage Conservation.

His research on the topic of modernist architecture has led to the delivery of papers and publications on the Saskatchewan Power Corporation Headquarters in Regina and the design of Canadian Airports of the 1960’s.

He has participated in UNESCO’s policy development on modern heritage in relation to World Heritage designations.

He co-curated the 2004 exhibition *Character and Controversy* at the Mendel Art Gallery exploring modernist architecture in Saskatchewan and the *Sun Never Sets* in 2008 at the Dunlop Art Gallery examining the Victoria Park Heritage Conservation district in Regina.

The renovation of his 450 sq. ft. condo in a designated

heritage building in Regina was published in the September 2009 issue of Canadian Architect magazine and has received both a Saskatchewan Lieutenant Governors Heritage award and a Prairie Design Award.

Todd Babiak

We are pleased to announce that the Keynote Speaker for Friday of our 2013 Municipal Heritage Forum is Todd Babiak.

Todd Babiak is a Canadian writer and entrepreneur living in Edmonton, Alberta. He is co-founder of [Story Engine](#), and has published three bestselling novels. His first novel, *Choke Hold*, was a finalist for the Rogers Writers' Trust Fiction Prize and a winner of the Henry Kreisel Award. His second novel, *The Garneau Block*, was a nominee for the Scotiabank Giller Prize, won the City of Edmonton Book Prize and was shortlisted for the Alberta Book Award for best novel. *The Book of Stanley* is in development as a television series. His screenplay *The Great One*, co-authored with Jason Margolis, won a Praxis Screenwriting Fellowship.

His fourth novel, *Toby: A Man*, was published by HarperCollins in January 2010. It was shortlisted for the Stephen Leacock Memorial Medal for Humour and won the Georges Bugnet Award for best work of fiction by an Alberta author. He was, for 10 years, a

columnist at the *Edmonton Journal*.

Overnight accommodation for attendees at the Municipal Heritage Forum is up to you. Feel free to choose from any hotels or places of lodging that suit your schedule and budget.

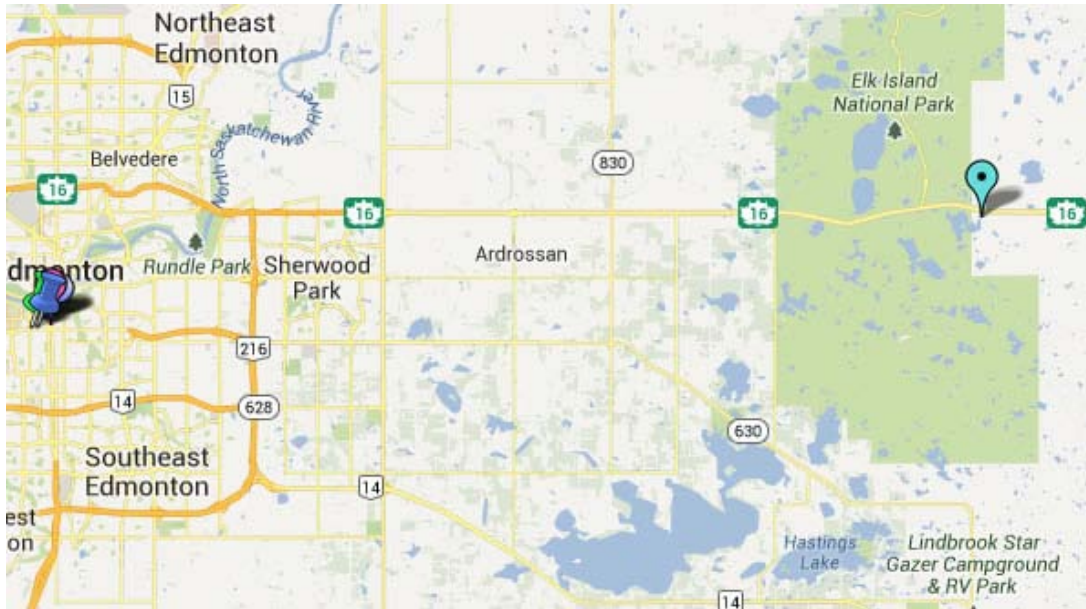
Parking

All day free parking is available to Forum Attendees on Thursday in the main parking lot at the Ukrainian Cultural Heritage Village.

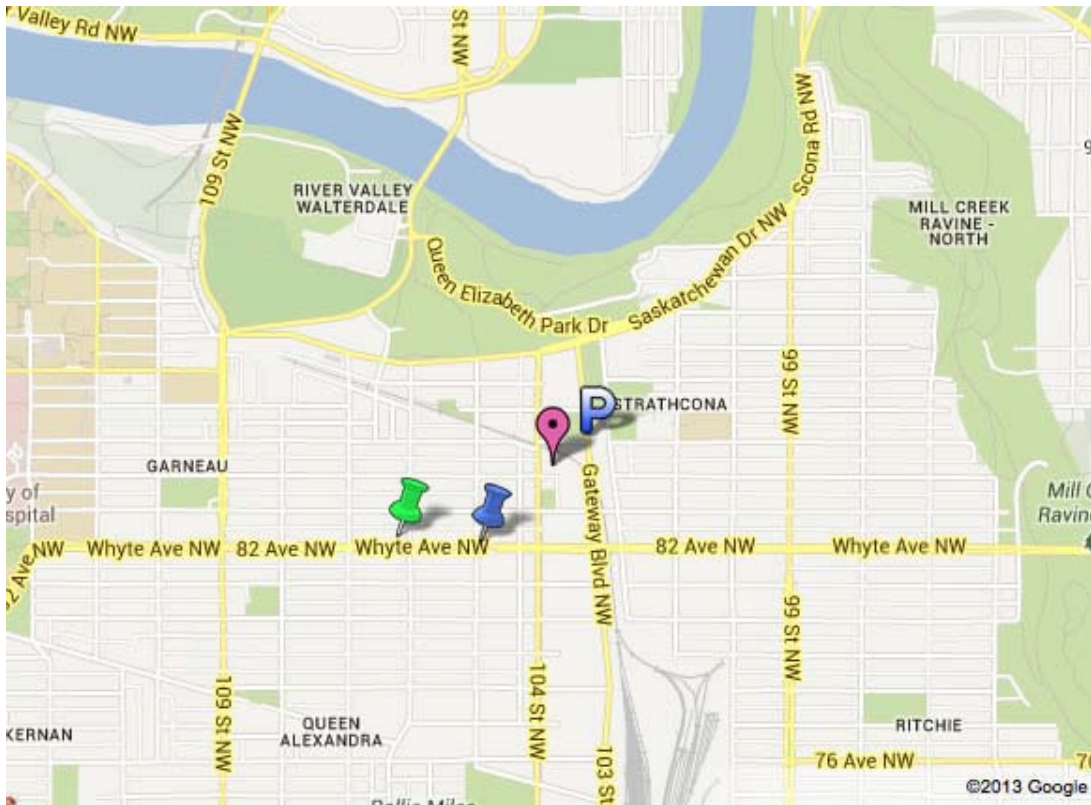
